Pennsylvania Fracking Ordinance Challenge Denied

On Tuesday, May 14, 2019, the Pennsylvania Supreme Court declined to hear a challenge to *Frederick v. Allegheny Twp. Zoning Hearing Bd.*, 196 A.3d 677 (Pa. Commw. Ct. 2018), which validated a Pennsylvania land-use ordinance permitting hydraulic fracturing in residential and agricultural areas. The Commonwealth Court held that the ordinance was a valid exercise of the Township's power to regulate oil and gas drilling within its borders.
